#### Pastor's Column: It Takes Practice

Maya Angelou once remarked, "I'm always amazed . . . when [people] walk up to me and say, 'I'm a Christian.' I think, 'Already? You've already got it? My goodness, you're fast.' The truth is, all day long you try to do it, try to be it. And then in the evening, if you're honest and have a little courage, you look at yourself and say, 'Hmmm. I only blew it 86 times. Not bad.'"

Being a disciple of Jesus is on one level as simple as responding to his invitation: "follow me." But following isn't always easy. So we are all works in progress. It takes practice to be a person of faith.

Fortunately, we can benefit from the experience of generations before us. Saints of every age have practiced their faith through prayer and Scripture study, for instance, and through acts of simplicity, generosity, and service. What are the spiritual practices that have been most formative and transformative in your life? Have you perhaps been searching for something to deepen or strengthen your faith? Are you interested in trying out a new spiritual practice during the season of Lent this year?

Sermons this spring will focus on a handful of spiritual practices that have been particularly meaningful to me; I hope they will prompt conversation so that we can all learn from one another.

Let's embrace our status as works in progress. There's much to be said for admitting this life of faith takes practice!

## **Children's Ministry Updates**

Our Big BLAST class (grades 2-5) continues learning stories from the Old Testament. In March we'll be learning about Moses, the Exodus of the Israelites from Egypt, and the 10 Commandments. The kids have been very engaged in discussing these important OT stories as they were with stories from Joseph's life in the book of Genesis earlier this winter.

Meanwhile, our BLAST Junior class (grades preK – 1) continues with New Testament stories. They have just finished learning about Paul's journeys and are now starting on Jesus' life.

Each week all of our kids gather to sing before moving to our respective classrooms. We are learning a couple new songs that we'll most likely sing for the congregation during the Easter season.

As always, it has been wonderful to have a strong team of volunteer teachers in BLAST Junior! I am also very thankful for many more adult helpers in these kids' classes! It is super important for us to always have 2 adults per classroom for safety and for a better learning experience for the kids. I have enjoyed getting to know some of you more through this partnership, and I hope that more of you will come and check out our lessons downstairs.

# **Supper Club Prize Winner**


